As you hear the performance, know that your attendance helps a special group of students enrolled in public high schools. Teens in alternative high schools are at risk of not graduating due to many and varied reasons—homelessness, disillusionment, lack of family support, learning difficulties, behavioral issues, and substance abuse. MDAEF supports these students through grants to teachers, scholarships to graduating seniors, and investments in school programs.

We fund classroom mini-grants and school-wide projects in the seriously underfunded alternative high schools. MDAEF awards scholarships to graduating seniors for community college or vocational school. We have given principals discretionary money for bus and BART tickets, school supplies, and other basics to help disadvantaged kids come to school. Working in partnership with Diablo Valley College, we pay for bus transportation to the DVC High School Recruitment Day - a day of hope and inspiration that shows alternative education students that higher education is possible, even for them.


